Spirituality in a Quantum Universe / WS – 641/ Fall 2019

COURSE DESCRIPTION

We are slowly beginning to realize – a growing number of us – that the fundamental principles of life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness are not the legacy of one nation only. They are universal. The unforgettable image of planet Earth as seen from outer space gives no indication of our increasingly insatiable need to divide and conquer, acquire and accumulate, separate and segregate those with more from those who are deemed less worthy individually, culturally, nationally, religiously, or biologically. We humans need a new narrative, one rooted in a fully inclusive worldview, one in which local realities are integral to the well-being of the whole, where the sacred is not set apart somewhere and relatively unattainable but is integral to all, where diversity is a blessing, and where everyone belongs. Such a reality is already here in those invisible forces within our quantum universe, where unseen energies already connect us all to one another. It is time for our spiritual energies to transcend imposed separations and allow the Spirit to fashion a world of compassionate interconnectedness and inner peace.

GOAL

The primary goal of this course is to introduce transformative spiritualty in such a way that students

- understand what it is and are able to articulate its scientific basis and its relevance for their own spiritual journey
- are aware of the dynamics and implications of living in a quantum universe
- are able to express concretely how a transformed perspective affects both behavior and belief

OUTCOMES

At the end of the course, students will be able to

- define transformative spirituality cognitively and experientially
- give examples from personal experience of what it means to live in and through the Spirit
- share a concrete example of how a transformed perspective has affected their own behavior and/or belief

Final Paper At the end of the course, submit a paper (approx. seven pages) based on what you have learned about transformative spirituality and how you have applied an aspect of it to your lived reality.
